

## **How Threlkeld School are spending the PE Premium 2017-2018**

Threlkeld School will receive £16,540 PE and Sport Premium funding for 2017/18 academic year, the funding has been and will be used in the following ways:

### **1. GLL**

Threlkeld and three other local Primary Schools have bought into a half day a week package with GLL. GLL help the PE coordinators to organise a variety of sports tournaments / festivals across all age groups and provides expert coaching for children and staff (in school and at after school clubs). A designated specialist PE Teacher Adam Whitfield, provides this service for us. For provision see the calendar of events

### **2. Allerdale School Sports Partnership**

Allerdale organise expert coaches to provide 4 blocks, of 1 hour per week sessions, for a duration of 5/6 week in a combination of curriculum and afterschool clubs. 2017-2018 coaches have delivered and are due to deliver: Tennis, kinder cricket, kwik cricket and multi-skills. Allerdale also organise district competitions and tournaments for the winners of local primary school events.

### **3. Staff inset training (including supply cover)**

Skip2Bfit, new PE curriculum, gymnastics and competitive games.

### **4. Cybercoach Membership**

Provides online fun and physical activities, such as wake and shake, PE/dance classes, wet play and after school club resources.

### **5. Local Rugby Coach**

All KS2 pupils benefit from a specialist rugby coach, who trains the children to play 'Touch Rugby' on a weekly basis throughout the summer term.

### **6. Extra swimming instructors**

Year 3- 6 have 20 sessions and Reception/Year 1 and 2 have 10 sessions of swimming over the academic year.

### **7. A day for the whole school at the Blencathra Centre doing outdoor activities.**

### **8. One day per half-term with Skip2Bfit and Box2Bfit coach Dave Gibson.**

Dave works with each class throughout the school day teaching, testing and monitoring children for progression. He then provides an afterschool club for children and parents. He also provides CPD for staff.

### **The Impact on the school of the PE Premium**

-Teachers and teaching assistants are more confident about teaching competitive sports after working with Allerdale and GLL specialist coaches.

-Pupils are now taught in smaller swimming groups and there are more staff trained to teach swimming. Pupils have enhanced teaching and learning opportunities resulting in more rapid development of swimming skills.

-Better quality equipment has motivated and increased physical activity participation of children.

-Children have received expert coaching in football, tennis, gymnastics, multiskills, cricket and have an increased number of festivals in which to take part. Expectations of children and staff have increased resulting in enhanced performance overall.

-The use of cyber coach has increased quality, quantity and range of physical activities within the school. Teachers and teaching assistants are more confident to deliver a variety of activities with this online resource

-Celebration assemblies and the PE notice board, makes pupils proud to have their achievements celebrated, it impacts on their confidence and self esteem. This is having an impact on learning across the curriculum. Talks from local and national sport personalities means that Pupils are inspired and encouraged to participate in their chosen sport.
