Phonics 'Letters and Sounds' Phase 1: Sound discrimination ' environmental, body, voice & instrumental sounds, rhythm & rhyme, alliteration, oral blending & segmenting / Phase 2: letters. Reading and writing own name. Turning pages in books, looking at illustrations & print in books & the environment. Texts include: Dear ZOO, Pig in the Pond, Farmer Duck, Little Red Hen, Brown Bear, My Cat Likes to Hide in Boxes, Traditional Rhymes/songs with animal theme, Hairy Mcclary...

Mathematics

Count up to 20 (and beyond)
Count accurately up to 10 objects
Recognise numerals
Say 1 more/1less of numbers
Explore 2D shapes
Add numbers up to total of 10
Compare measures of length, height, weight.
Recite the days of the week
Explore how long a minute is

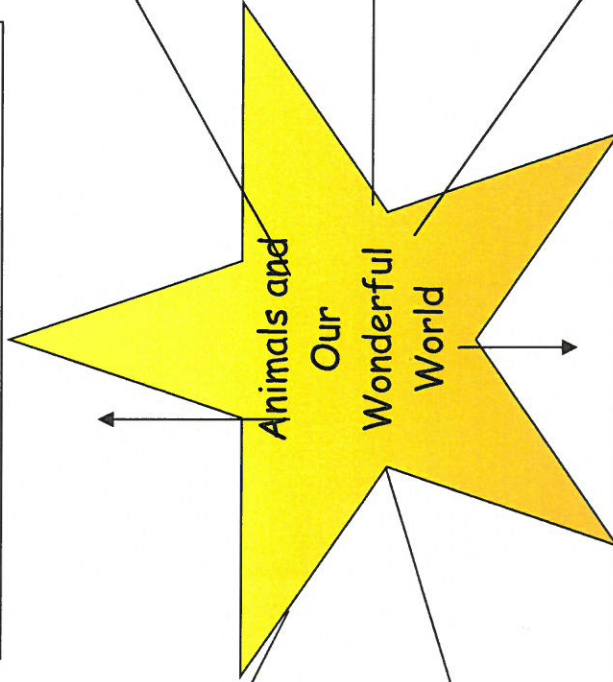

Poetry - Hairy McLary, animal poems.
Non fiction- Animal facts, recycling, instructions for cooking.

Order no. to 10,20,100 and beyond.
Say 1/10 more or less up to 100.
Learn all pairs of numbers that total 10.
Addition and subtraction including money.
Days of the week/ months of the year.
O'clock times.
Explore 2D shapes and symmetry. Describe 3D shapes.
