### Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Aim	Outcome
Attainment and Progress in English	Attainment and progress improving across school. Trial of Talk4Writing in the Summer Term had an impact on the standard of speaking and listening in Class Two. Evidence of improved writing evident during Keswick primaries moderation.

Develop Character/Self Esteem	The work with the Theatre by the Lake Educational Officer helped improve pupil self-esteem. The targeted disadvantaged pupils participated fully in the sessions and enjoyed performing to the school. The pupils also thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to perform at the Theatre by the Lake.
Attainment and Progress in Numeracy	Attainment and progress in Numeracy improving across this school. This was evidenced in monitoring and KS2 outcomes. Introduction of TT Rockstars has resulted in the majority of KS2 pupils knowing all multiplication/division facts, this has helped their fluency and reasoning. Teacher led intervention groups has also improved pupils knowledge of all areas of the maths curriculum.
